

How to get to AMOLF by car

Coming from the ring road A10

All highways to Amsterdam result in ring road A10. The s-routes are city routes guiding you into the city. Science Park Amsterdam is located near s113.

- Travelling from Amersfoort, choose directions Utrecht/Den Haag.
- Travelling from Utrecht, Den Haag, Schiphol, Haarlem en Zaandam follow signs to Amersfoort.
 - Take exit Watergraafsmeer/s113
 - Follow the signs to Watergraafsmeer/Science Park
 - By now you're on the Middenweg
 - Turn right onto Kruislaan
 - Continue and after the tunnel you've reached Science Park Amsterdam
 - After the tunnel turn left onto the Carolina Mac Gillavrylaan
 - Turn right and take the entrance to the Science Park
 - AMOLF is the first building to the left after the entrance.

If your satellite navigation system is unable to find our visiting address, try typing in Carolina Mac Gillavrylaan 104.

How to get to AMOLF by public transport

Metro/Bus

From Amsterdam Central Station or Duivendrecht station

- * Take the metro direction Amstelstation
- * Take bus 40 direction Muiderpoortstation or bus 240 direction Science Park Amsterdam
- * Get out at the stop Station Science Park.

Tram/Bus

From Amsterdam Central Station

- * Take tram 9 direction Middenweg
- * Transfer to bus 40 or bus 240 at the stop Kruislaan
- * Get out at the stop Station Science Park.

From Amsterdam Muiderpoortstation

- * Take bus 40 direction Amstelstation
- * Get out at the stop Station Science Park.

Train

Twice an hour a train stops at station “Amsterdam Science Park”

From Amsterdam Central Station

- * Take the train to Science Park A'dam
- * Get out at the stop Science Park A'dam

From Almere Oostvaarders

- * Take the train to Science Park A'dam
- * Get out at the stop Science Park A'dam
